On June 5, 2017, the Department of Finance received the following request for access to information:

- As a member of Cabinet and various Cabinet Committees, and as the President of Treasury Board, which is also a Committee of Cabinet, the Minister is provided briefing materials on a weekly basis regarding upcoming agenda items. These briefings are Cabinet Confidences and therefore have not been included in the above listing, pursuant to section 27(1)(i) and section 27(2)(a) of the ATIPPA.

Please be advised that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review the processing of your access request, as set out in section 42 of the Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act (the Act). A request to the Commissioner must be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner. You may also appeal directly to the Supreme Court Trial Division within 15 business days after you receive the decision of the public body, pursuant to section 52 of the Act.

It is the goal to have the responsive records posted to the Completed Access to Information Requests website within one business day following the applicable period of time. Please note that requests for personal information will not be posted online.
