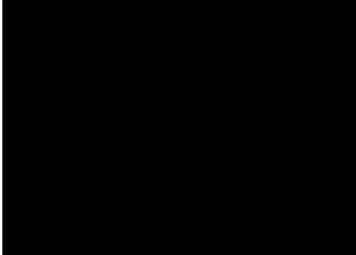

**Re: Your request for access to information under Part II of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (File # NR-22-2020)**

On January 29, 2020, the Department of Natural Resources received your request for access to the following records/information:

**All government document the objected to the development by John Tuach and associated companies, Candore Operating Co Ltd, Newminex, United Bolero Development Crop of the Barite and Base metal held by and under any license under their control ie. Licenses #4296 and any licenses number changes thereafter up to 2012. See Attached 1986 Indenture.**

The Department of Natural Resources have reviewed this request and conducted a search of both our paper and electronic file systems, which did not locate any responsive records specific to the request noted above.

The Department wishes to advise that Ground Staked licences were issued on the island portion of the province prior to September 1995, after which only Map Staked licenses were issued. Map Staked licences were differentiated with "M" after the licence number. All remaining ground staked licenses were converted to map staked licenses in 2004. Thus any licence without the "M" at the end is referring to as an old Ground Staked Licence number that no longer exists. This includes License #4296 referenced above. Any of the old Ground Staked License files that were located in the Department that exceeded their retention scheduling periods as of September 2018 in accordance with Government of Newfoundland and Labrador information management policy were no longer kept, thus we have minimal records relating to this request.

Please be advised that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review

the processing of your access request, as set out in section 42 of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (the *Act*). A request to the Commissioner must be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner.
