Re: Your request for access to information under Part II of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (File # NR-87-2018)

On June 6, 2018, the Department of Natural Resources received your request for access to the following records/information:

All records related to attendance at community consultation sessions held in relation to the construction/operation of the nickle processing facility in Long Harbour. I am specifically interested in any commentary on attendance and on the participation of attendees. This can be date limited to 2006.

The Department of Natural Resources have reviewed this request and conducted a search, which did not locate any responsive records specific to the attendance at community consultation sessions held in relation to the construction/operation of the nickel processing facility in Long Harbour. Community consultations are facilitated by the company, not the Department of Natural Resources, which may explain the lack of records in our custody and control. As you have advised this request was also made with the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment they may have records responsive to this request.

Please be advised that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review the processing of your access request, as set out in section 42 of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (the *Act*). A request to the Commissioner must be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner.

You may also appeal directly to the Supreme Court Trial Division within 15 business days after you receive the decision of the public body, pursuant to section 52 of the *Act*.
