Re: Your request for access to information under Part II of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (File # NR-112-2018)

On August 14, 2018, the Department of Natural Resources received your request for access to the following records/information:

Reports, interim reports, correspondence, documents related to (1) the March 29, 2017 Husky SeaRose iceberg near miss as well as (2) the subsequent C-NLOPB suspension of the SeaRose in Jan. 2018; and (3) the ongoing or concluded C-NLOPB investigation and report about the SeaRose iceberg near miss incident. Note: I have already read the publicly available General Assembly Proceedings with discussions between the Minister of Natural Resources and the Assembly, so am looking for additional information, correspondence, reports, documents, etc.

Please be advised that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review the processing of your access request, as set out in section 42 of the *Access to*

Information and Protection of Privacy Act (the Act). A request to the Commissioner must be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner.

You may also appeal directly to the Supreme Court Trial Division within 15 business days after you receive the decision of the public body, pursuant to section 52 of the *Act*.

It is the goal to have the letter posted to the Office of Public Engagement's website within one business day following the applicable period of time.
