Re: Your request for access to information under Part II of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act, 2015* [Our File #: AESL/030/2019]

On April 23, 2019 the Department of Advanced Education, Skills and Labour received your request for access to the following records/information:

**“All emails sent/received re Young Liberals, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] & [REDACTED] from 2015 to present”**

Per your April 24, 2019 telephone conversation with Mr. David Moore, Director of Information Management, you agreed to limit the search for responsive emails to the Minister, Deputy Minister and Assistant Deputy Ministers of the department.

Please be advised that access to one record, consisting of four pages, has been refused in accordance with the following exception to disclosure, as specified in the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act, 2015*:

Section 40. (1) The head of a public body shall refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant where the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.

The *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act, 2015* (act) requires us to provide an advisory response within 10 days of receiving the request. As this request has been completed prior to day 10, this letter also serves as our Advisory Response.

Section 42 of the act provides that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review the processing of this request or you may appeal the refusal to the Supreme Court Trial Division. A request to the Information and Privacy Commissioner shall be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner.



In the event you wish to appeal to the Supreme Court, you must do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Section 52 of the act sets out the process to be followed when filing such an appeal.

Please be advised that this letter will be published following a 72 hour period after it is sent electronically to you or five business days in the case where records are mailed to you. It is the goal to have the letter posted to the Completed Access to Information Requests website within one business day following the applicable period of time.
